

NATIONAL ARBORETUM CANBERRA

Make your visit to Canberra memorable for you and your students with a visit to one of Canberra's top tourist and educational destinations.



The National Arboretum Canberra offers 250 hectares of education, adventure, and excitement for your next school visit to Canberra.

The Arboretum is only a five-minute drive from the Canberra CBD and is home to 94 forests comprising of rare, endangered, and symbolic trees from Australia and around the world. With over 20km of walking trails, the famous POD Playground, a Bush Tucker Garden and some of the best views across Canberra, find out why teachers give the National Arboretum Canberra a 4.6 star rating.

Catering from the early years through to senior high school, our education programs and hands on workshops are linked to the STEM national curriculum and we offer a range of day and evening programs. Whatever the age of your class, your interest, and your time restraints, we have a program for you! With plenty of room to stretch the legs, we also offer free coach parking, restroom facilities, a café, picnic spaces and catering options.

POD PLAYGROUND

You could be mistaken for thinking that giant squirrels live in Canberra. Oversized raised acorn cubbies with slides and interconnecting net tunnels high above the ground are met with shrieks of delight as children disappear into an immersive creative world of play.

Designed for children of all ages, the award-winning POD Playground at the National Arboretum Canberra (pictured on the cover) is a haven of fun and learning. Inspired by the concept of seeds as the beginning of life in the forest, this playground offers an exciting and challenging environment that encourages children of all ages to climb, explore, learn, and most importantly, have fun.

As soon as children step foot into the POD Playground, they are greeted with a world of wonders. From the giant acorn cubbies, nest swings, banksia pods, sand pits and music-making instruments are just some of the captivating features that await them. Surrounded by breathtaking views, this unique and adventurous playground sparks wonder, imagination, and enchantment, while promoting activity and spontaneity in play but not a squirrel in sight!

The POD playground is conveniently located next to the free coach parking, has shaded seating, restrooms and is conveniently located close to the café in the Village Centre.

Most schools will book a program followed by a time slot in the POD Playground (it's free) and allow time for a lunch break in the amphitheatre. This is a highlight not to be missed!

With eleven different guided walks, workshops, and experiences to choose from, students can immerse in learning through the fascinating world of trees.

Our programs explore the impact of weather and climate on tree growth and health, utilizing the diverse forests at the Arboretum as living examples. Why do trees grown where? One of most popular programs is our First Nations experience 'Our Place Your Place' where students learn about local Ngunnawal culture in our Bush Tucker Garden.

>> BOOKINGS & DEPOSITS

To confirm a quotation, a non-refundable deposit of \$50 - \$100 per student is required (depending on travel arrangements). Deposits will be due within 4 weeks of booking accommodation, or 2 weeks where airfares have been required.

>> TOUR COSTS

Our tours are fully inclusive and the costs are based on students covering the cost of teachers. Prices are subject to change due to external influences and/or if there is a change in student/ supervisor numbers and ratios.

>> TIME OF TRAVEL - CANBERRA

Canberra is very popular during Term 3, mainly due to the Snowy Mountains option that can be included for students. Remember though, if traveling to the snow is not a key driver of your school's excursion, there are considerable savings to be made during Term 1. Contact Unearth-Ed to get a list of the savings your school can make.

Parliamentary sitting dates are also a key driver for schools, so if this component is a key reason for travelling to Canberra, be sure to check the dates and, more importantly, accommodation availability.

All other destinations advertised are available for travel all year round.

>> ITINERARY

Be mindful of timing when sending or submitting your 'wish list' of attractions so that you are not disappointed if your preferred attractions are not available for your travel dates.

When planning your choice of destinations, remember to contact Unearth-Ed should you need any further details for any venues. Consider if you would like morning or afternoon stops in your itinerary.

Schools are booking up to 3 years in advance, so to secure your preferred date please get in early.

>> ACCOMMODATION

Unearth-Ed offers various types of accommodation - motels, cabins, bunkhouses etc - so when booking, try to have some idea of accommodation that your school requires. Also, most accommodation includes a meal package so be sure to enquire whether they will meet any dietary or religious requirements of students.

>> TRANSPORT



The Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER)

The Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) is an initiative of the Australian Government which provides financial assistance for students in Year 4-12 across Australia to travel to Canberra, the nation's capital.

Under PACER, students are able to experience civics and citizenship learnt first hand by visiting Parliament House, Museum of Australian Democracy (MoAD), National Electoral Education Centre (NEEC) and the Australian War Memorial as well as a number of other sites of cultural and historical interest.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How much PACER funding will my school receive?

The program operates as a rebate which is paid direct to schools that meets the eligibility requirements for funding. The payment is a subsidy and is not meant to cover all costs. The website www.Googlemaps.com will be used to determine the distance for the most favourable travelling routes to Canberra which might not be the shortest route. Funds are allocated on a per student basis at rates varying according to distance travelled.

How long before the excursion do I need to submit our PACER application?

We recommend you submit your application and confirmed itinerary as soon as possible but no later than three weeks prior to your excursion. Funding is limited and applications are dealt with in order of receipt.

What attractions do I need to visit to be eligible for the **Parliament and Civics Education Rebate?**

To receive PACER your travel itinerary must include Parliament House, Australian War Memorial, National Electoral Education Centre or Museum of Australian Democracy. More information can be found on our National Institutions page.

If my school is taking part in a combined excursion with another school/s do we need to complete separate applications?

Each school must complete their own PACER application, regardless of whether they are travelling together with another school.

What happens once we submit a PACER application and itinerary?

You will be notified within two weeks as to whether your application has been successful.

What is the Exploring Civics and Citizenship Through a Visit to the National Capital Canberra education resource?

These educational resources have been developed to prepare students for their trip to the National Capital and should be used to demonstrate how you have linked the excursion to classwork. These resources can be downloaded on the PACER website

in Visual Art, History, Civics and Citizenship, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Activism. We also facilitate Visual Thinking Strategies, a critical thinking and visual literacy program for all levels of education.



These three popular ski resorts offer their own unique characteristics, especially when it comes to skiing for School Students. 




